

Key Stage 3 Curriculum Overview

Our curriculum is a through curriculum from EYFS to the end of KS4. Priority is given to core subjects and removing barriers to learning caused by social, communication learning difficulties. Our aim is to ensure that pupils are able to access appropriate post-16 courses, supported internships and or employment. Our pupils follow the national curriculum in key-stage 3. Year 7 curriculum follows on from the work done in primary phase. In year 9 pupils begin a supported transition onto their key-stage 4 pathway.
