In our Early Years classes pupils will experience learning through play and be taught in very small ability groups. As our pupils grow in confidence and their ability to interact develops, our pupils engage increasingly in formal learning in a supportive and nurturing environment. In Key-stage 1 and 2 pupils follow the Primary National Curriculum in mixed age classes in small ability groups. The emphasis is on building firm foundations for literacy, numeracy, communication and social interaction.
