- I am lucky that I get to meet so many young people and teachers and really enjoy sharing my experiences and knowledge by delivering training.



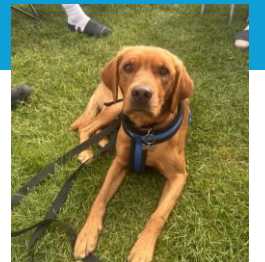
My Name is Jenny
